The New Year, the End of “End of History”, and the Tasks for Revolutionaries

“The new generation wants to be strong.” – José Carlos Mariátegui

The United States finds itself in a profound state of crisis. Behind the growing tendency towards fascism is the global decline in the rate of profit, characterized by rising inflation, ballooning debt, and increased competition by imperialist rivals China and Russia. In the face of impending mass rebellion, US imperialism responds by further restructuring the economy and society, unleashing more brutal exploitation and an all-round reactionary ideological, political, and cultural offensive of divide and conquer, especially targeting the migrant and nationally oppressed workers. The threat of imperialist war looms over Latin America as the US desperately seeks to maintain its status as the top plunderer and enemy of the world's people. The general crisis of imperialism, which began in the 1980s, is increasingly leading to a new series of inter-imperialist wars for the redivision of the world.

Donald Trump is unable to stop the developing and deepening economic crisis much like previous presidents. He speeds up the process of fascistization, even though this can only lead to more sharpening of contradictions on all sides. Meanwhile, suffering and want of the class has grown more acute, accompanying a massive deterioration of the working and living conditions not seen since the Great Recession. Uprisings of the nationally oppressed are now appearing across the country. These, while sporadic and weak, have the potential to develop further.

In short, the objective conditions are ripe for great social change.

Nonetheless, the subjective forces for such change in the current moment remain largely lacking. False divisions are sown among the masses by capitalists, through their demagogues and agents, to facilitate the development of corporativization in different ways. The working class, lacking its highest form of organization, is unable to articulate itself as a class-for-itself. The revolutionary movement continues to be largely dominated by the petit-bourgeoisie and labor aristocracy who unite in their isolation outside the multinational working class. The opportunists continue to babble about the need for patience, drawing the masses away from militant class struggle and back into the fold of electoral politics; to the hands of the Democratic Party, another faction of the ruling class equally eager for fascism.

The sincere spirits of the revolution have not yet occupied their rightful place. In their stead, there are still sectarian egoisms and willful incomprehension, “dogmatic spirits that seek to petrify and immobilize life.”

A strong foundation for proletarian politics has been laid through shared struggle and determination, but it remains a foundation. There is much work to be done. The unity of revolutionary workers and oppressed nations, alongside their organization in the

Just as we together will win a small demand, with unity, struggle, and organization, our class can overthrow this bloodthirsty system once and for all through socialist revolution, and establish a new world without exploitation of man by man.

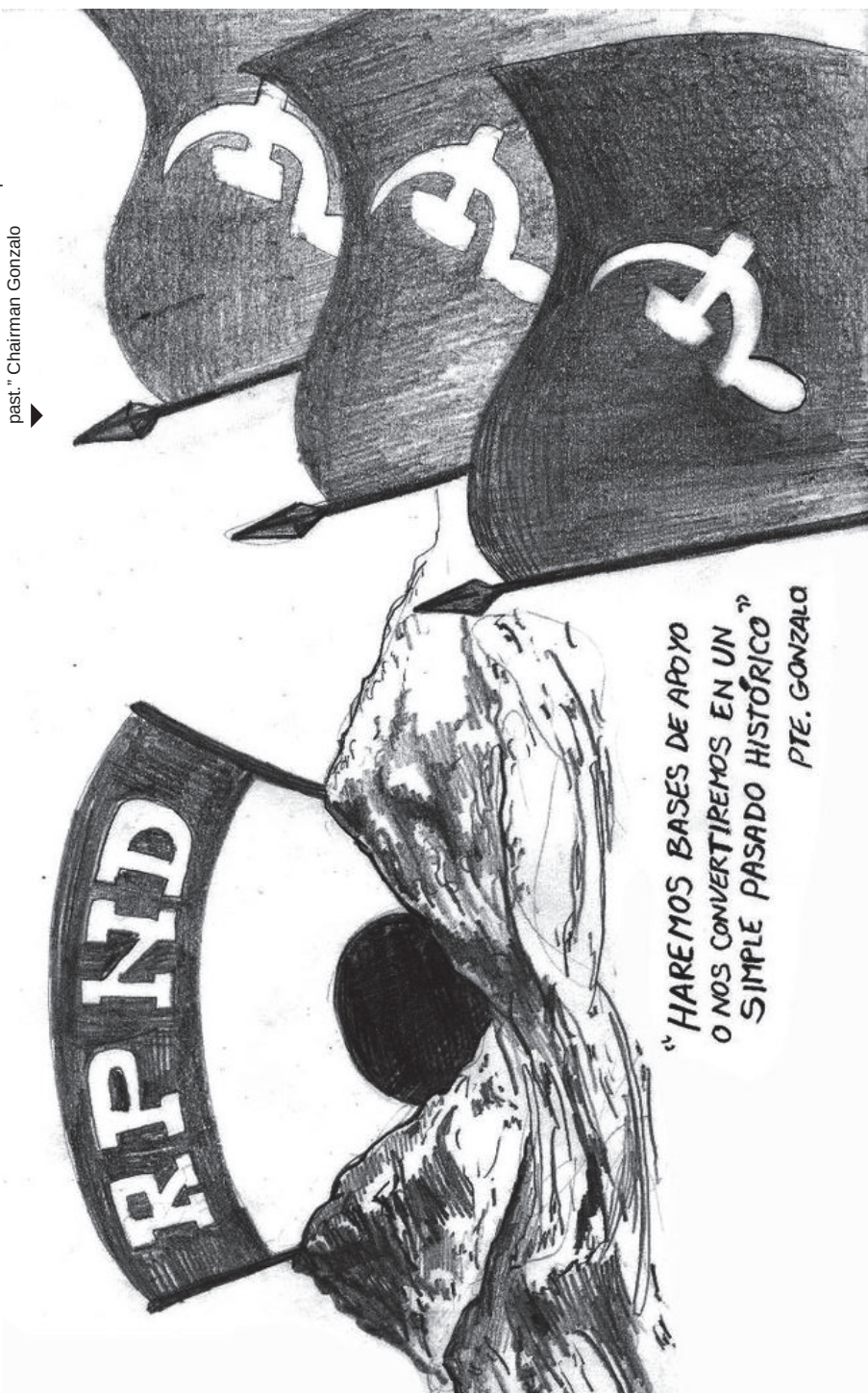

also known as **imperialism**. There is no power vacuum that we can build on: every gain, no matter how small, is a gain that we need to seize from the hands of the class enemy through struggle.

When we speak of struggling for demands without connecting it to the struggle for

Power, it means we are ignoring the root cause of our issues, imperialism, which is constantly creating more misery and pain for the working class and will eventually take away the gains of the working class if it is not overturned and there is not coordinated struggle against it. Worse, when we don't connect the day-to-day demands to the struggle for political Power for the working class, we end up defending the imperialist system and standing on the side of counter-revolution, telling the masses and ourselves that change can be done without destroying this rotten Old order.

This is why, Lenin, leader of the Russian Revolution, put it like this: "All is illusory without Power." In all of our struggles,

whether big or small, it is imperative for us to link and raise them to the central question: the fight to seize political Power for the modern working class, the proletariat. Even in a struggle for better working conditions, or a struggle for democratic demands such as the right to abortion, activists need to highlight these issues are just a part of the

overall capitalist system that we live under, and use the method of mass struggle and militant organization – instead of reformism or collaboration – to demonstrate the collective strength of the masses to make history.

The centrality of the struggle to seize political Power for the workers plays out differently at the different levels of work. On the highest level, Communists-in-formation must carry out the central task of reconstituting our Communist Party, doing so in a correct way which combats opportunism and revisionism at every turn, and that struggles to provide leadership to the revolutionaries-in-formation and masses in the United States. On the lowest level, that of the mass movement, revolutionaries-in-formation must work to mobilize, politicize, and organize the masses through class struggle, a task which, when done and lead correctly, serves the conquest of political Power for the US multinational proletariat.

Chairman Gonzalo of the Communist Party of Peru said it well: "Organize the masses so that they can go beyond what is permitted by the existing legal order, so that they struggle to destroy the old order and not to maintain it." What's the most important for us is not to operate within the legal order so that we can achieve short-term gains, but instead to unite the masses in class struggle, to make

class-conscious and militant mass movement, is an urgent and pending task. Myopia, self-interest, and tiring cholerich evocations cannot serve the cause of our class. As the ruling class has embarked on a decided and determined path towards fascism and world war – the natural consequence and only way to resolve this great crisis – the mass movement cannot give anything other than a direct response, that of establishing itself on the basis of struggling against reformism, opportunism, and revisionism. On the other side of the coin, this means to unite along common revolutionary principles, practice, and program, to discard all sectarian criteria and

standing in its way. There are many challenges before us, but we can overcome them – if we are honest and persistent in Marxist methods. Let us salute today the people of Peru, India, Turkey, and the Philippines, walking on the path of struggle, as role models and harbingers of change. Capitalism has produced the proletariat, the last class of history. "Every epoch not only dreams the next, but while dreaming impels it towards wakefulness." In the war of position charted by the capitalist class, amid its own crisis of faith, science, and reason, the partisan of revolution plainly responds by transforming reality with their powerful hands.

Our Principles:

The Importance of Political Power

The central question that confronts all revolutionaries-in-information in the United States is, "what are we fighting for?" Depending on who you ask, different people might give a variety of answers to this question: from higher wages, to defunding the police, to an arms embargo on Israel, et cetera.

At a glance, there seems to be a myriad of things people fight *for* and *against*, and a myriad of ways to achieve those different objectives. Some argue for a legislative path within the Old State: attempting to elect "people", "progressive" candidates in local and national elections. Others rely on the courts, lawyer-mediated negotiations and other methods encouraged by the legal order to achieve their aims, while others still stress the importance of building "people power" or "dual power", by forming charities and "mutual aid" organizations to resolve the immediate needs of the people without directly challenging the current system.

These single-issue answers and reformist methods forget an important reality: no gains for the working class will be permanent if they are not tied to the struggle for political Power. That is, tied to the struggle to destroy the entire Old Society and to replace it by a new one controlled by the working class through its class dictatorship; the "dictatorship of the proletariat" in comparison to the current "dictatorship of the bourgeoisie".

The word "power" has often been misused in activist spaces. People often talk about Power as if it is something that we already have, or something we can build peacefully outside of the existing social structure. In part this is due a confusion of terms: there is the everyday use of the word "power", as in the *power* to do or achieve something, and then there is also the use of the term "Power" (usually written with a capital-"P") when discussing a revolutionary political process. So, for example, there is the workers' everyday power to withhold their labor (strike), organize themselves, achieve their demands etc., and then there is the workers' oppressed by the modern capitalist system

Power in terms of the establishment and construction of their New State.

In reality, political Power is something very concrete: it is the Power of one class to rule over the other through violence. Today, it is the capitalists and their Old State that have the Power in our society: they use their police, legal system, economic control, and their military to enforce their rule, cracking down on anyone who might pose a threat, and using all other forms of State organs, from schools to media, to help facilitate this rule.

Today, the international working class and the oppressed peoples of the world do not have Power anywhere despite having produced the commodities, built the buildings, extracted the raw materials, and run the logistics chains within all societies across the globe. The prison system, the military-industrial complex, and the police are just parts of the same capitalist State, who extends its reach to every facet of our society. For every minute of our work and even our existence, we are exploited and oppressed by the modern capitalist system

Down with the Imperialist War on Venezuela!

Update January 3, 4:42a.m.: Donald Trump has announced the capture of Venezuelan President Maduro and his wife. While the information remains unconfirmed, this attempt at regime-change, practiced by US imperialism in countries from Iran to Guatemala throughout the 20th century, is the most blatant demonstration of the principal contradiction in the world – between imperialism on the one hand and the oppressed nations and peoples on the other. nondisclosure regimes, and platform interfaces. The bourgeois intellectuals attribute productivity to the model, but the model's apparent powers are found in the social and productive relations. In other words the increased productivity of the social process of production is real, but the specifically capitalist use of that productivity is to deepen exploitation, to separate intellectual powers of production from the workers who produce them, and to convert those powers into an alien force confronting labor.

A distinctive feature of AI within capitalism is the capture of unpaid labor in and around consumption and communication. Platform architectures convert ordinary activity into behavioral traces, feedback, and content that can be appropriated as inputs for training and as commodities for advertising markets. This does not invalidate the Law of Value; it clarifies the breadth of expropriation capital can perform without giving the equivalent exchange to the producers. Capital can seize use values, social knowledge, and informational products outside the wage relation and then deploy them to cheapen variable capital, accelerate circulation, and fortify monopoly advantage. The point is not that data creates value as such, but that property relations and platform control allow the appropriation of social labor and social knowledge on a vast scale while paying little or nothing for it. In the resulting ideological fog, exploitation is misrecognized as innovation, and expropriation is redescribed as “intelligence”.

AI's class effects follow from this structure. The labor process is fragmented into hierarchical layers: a comparatively protected core workforce, a semi-peripheral layer of contractors and vendors, and a large outer belt of precarious data labor and operations labor. This segmentation is not incidental. It is a tactic which isolates strata from one another, blocks collective identification, and ensures that the most exploited links are also the least visible and least organized. At the same time, AI deployment reorganizes work in adjacent sectors by deskilling

and standardizing tasks, increasing competitive pressure and enlarging the reserve army.

“So soon as the handling of this tool becomes the work of a machine, then, with the use-value, the exchange-value too, of the workman's labour-power vanishes; the workman becomes unsaleable... That portion of the working-class, thus by machinery rendered superfluous, i.e., no longer immediately necessary for the self-expansion of capital, either goes to the wall... or else floods all the more easily accessible branches of industry, swamps the labour-market, and sinks the price of labour-power below its value. ... since machinery is continually seizing upon new fields of production, its temporary effect is really permanent... Hence, the character of independence and estrangement... is developed by means of machinery into a thorough antagonism.”

-Karl Marx, Capital: Volume I, Part IV, Chapter 15, Section 5 “The Strife between Workman and Machine”

Under contemporary conditions, this antagonism appears in a double movement. First, AI is used to reorganize clerical and service work so that tasks can be pushed downward in wages and outward into precarious contracting. Second, AI's capital intensity concentrates infrastructure into a limited number of chokepoints: data centers, network backbones, chip supply, and platform interfaces. This creates potential strategic leverage even as it deepens domination. Where work is concentrated and where turnover depends on continuous flows, disruption has systemic effects. The contradiction is therefore sharp. AI fragments labor into atomized tasks, yet it simultaneously depends on tightly coupled infrastructures and cooperative labor at scale.

The ideological function of AI discourse is to make relations between human workers appear disappeared. “Autonomous intelligence” is the contemporary fetish form in which social cooperation appears as the self-activity of a thing, and in which the machine's apparent productivity is treated as the source of profit. This fetishism is

reinforced by the financial and rentier layers of AI capital. Platform access, API billing, subscription fees, and capitalization of future revenue streams present profit as if it were generated by ownership of an asset rather than by exploitation in production and redistribution through monopoly.

“As interest-bearing capital... capital assumes its pure fetish form, $M - M'$ being the subject... the saleable thing... the surplus-value produced by it... appears as an inherent part of it...”

In interest-bearing capital the movement of capital is contracted. The intervening process is omitted... Capital is now a thing, but as a thing it is capital. Money is now pregnant... interest on it grows, no matter whether it is awake or asleep, is at home or abroad, by day or by night... Thus interest-bearing money-capital... fulfils the most fervent wish of the hoarder.”

AI “hype” reproduces this contracted movement; the soaring valuation, the language of network effects, faith that the models generate money by their own intrinsic properties. The intervening process is omitted: the extraction of minerals, the industrial fabrication, the energy usage, the labor of labeling and moderation, the sales labor, the state subsidies and public contracts, the outsourcing regimes that conceal exploitation, and the enormous circulation costs required to realize revenue at scale. When AI is treated as a thing that creates value, the class relation is obscured. What is in fact the social power of collective labor is presented as the private power of an object owned by capital.

sensitive to data volume, model size, and training compute.

That architecture does not make the model “reason” in any human sense. It makes it effective at representing and reproducing complex conditional distributions over language. When such models are adapted for instruction following or dialogue, additional stages such as supervised fine tuning and preference based optimization are used to align outputs with desired formats and constraints, but the underlying engine remains a trained statistical mapping. This is why the same model can appear as assistant, summarizer, classifier, translator, or generator: these are all different ways of steering the same conditional distribution through prompting, fine tuning, or tool integration.

Political Economy of AI and the Commodity Question of Data:

As iterated above, artificial intelligence is not an entity with agency but a determinate configuration of the labor process, a reordering of cooperation, supervision, and circulation under capitalist command. The decisive question is not whether the model is “intelligent”, but how it functions as dead labor confronting living labor, as a means of production inserted to cheapen commodities, discipline workers, accelerate turnover, and expand surplus value through relative surplus labor. In this respect, AI continues the historical tendency Marx identifies in modern industry: the inversion in which the worker no longer employs the instrument, but is employed by it, and in which the social powers of labor appear as powers of capital. The algorithm is not merely a tool; it is a managerial and technical apparatus that decomposes complex labor into legible operations, standardizes performance, and centralizes conception and control. It is a new form of the old factory logic, extended into offices, warehouses, classrooms, media production, and state administration. The “assistant” and “copilot” rhetoric is a political veil over a practical project: to reorganize living labor so it can be measured, ranked, made interchangeable, and compelled to higher throughput at lower cost.

“In handicrafts and manufacture, the workman makes use of a tool, in the factory, the machine makes use of him. There the movements of the instrument of labour proceed from him, here it is the movements of the machine that he must follow. In manufacture the workmen are parts of a living mechanism. In the factory we have a lifeless mechanism independent of the workman, who becomes its mere living appendage.

... Every kind of capitalist production, in so far as it is not only a labour-process, but also a process of creating surplus-value, has this in common, that it is not the workman that employs the instruments of labour, but the instruments of labour that employ the workman. But it is only in the factory system that this inversion for the first time acquires technical and palpable reality. By means of its conversion into an automaton, the instrument of labour confronts the labourer, during the labour-process, in the shape of capital, of dead labour, that dominates, and pumps dry, living labour-power.”

– Karl Marx, *Capital: Volume I, Part IV, Section 4 “The Factory”*

AI helps capital do what it has always attempted: make labor power cheaper, more controllable, and more replaceable.

This is the inner logic of AI as foreman. The concrete novelty is the extension of factory discipline into spheres long managed by professional discretion or informal managerial coordination. AI systems are introduced to routinize judgment, to render tacit knowledge explicit and ownable, and to convert complex activity into streams of quantifiable outputs. In practice, “AI adoption” frequently means an administrative reengineering project: new metrics, new performance regimes, new task composition, and new surveillance. The direct target is the labor time necessary for a given output and the bargaining power that attaches

to skill, scarcity, and autonomy. The indirect target is the worker’s capacity to resist speedup and to organize on the basis of collective knowledge of the process. AI helps capital do what it has always attempted: make labor power cheaper, more controllable, and more replaceable.

The growth of AI capital is simultaneously, and unavoidably, a growth of constant capital. The headlines harbinging AI are carried by a material boom in chips, servers, cooling, storage, land acquisition, and energy. This raises the organic composition of capital: a larger mass of machinery and materials is set in motion by a relatively smaller mass of labor. Under the Law of Value, this intensifies pressure on profitability and thus increases the compulsion to expand the rate of exploitation and to seek countervailing mechanisms through monopoly, rent, and state subsidy. AI’s capital intensity makes utilization a class weapon: fixed capital must be kept running, and the workforce becomes an obstacle whenever it interrupts the rhythm of production and circulation. To be more clear, all machines do not create new value, which depends on workers: this is the key to understanding the rise of AI. The more massive the fixed outlays, the more ferocious the drive to accelerate turnover, tighten labor discipline, and secure guaranteed markets via contracts and procurement. The political-economic logic of AI therefore cannot be reduced simply to a drive for efficiency.

AI systems and services condense a cooperative labor process distributed across occupations, firms, and borders. The visible layers are engineers, researchers, product managers, and sales engineers. The less visible layers are annotation workers, content moderators, quality testers, data center technicians, network operators, security guards, janitorial staff, and the entire chain of extraction, fabrication, and logistics. AI appears immaterial only because the imperialist division of labor displaces its materiality into mines, fabrication hubs, shipping routes, and power plants, and because the labor of maintenance and labeling is structurally hidden behind contractors,

Analyzing the Role of Artificial “Intelligence” in Capitalism (Part I)

The bourgeoisie and their technicians call it artificial intelligence. Scientific Socialism identifies a new arrangement of old relations, a fresh mask on the same face of exploitation. Strip off the mystique, and the same workers appear: engineers and researchers; annotators and moderators; miners, logistics crews, and line workers who feed the insatiable hunger for chips, batteries, and servers. It is a chain of living labor bound to machinery and capital, commanded for the same end as ever: more surplus from fewer hands in less time.

The appropriate method is to investigate a social relation rather than worship or panic before a machine. Who commands this labor process? Who owns the patents? Where is surplus extracted and where is it realized? What is data: commodity, input, or pretext for rent? Which strata are pushed further down the ladder, and which are drawn into new points of leverage? How does the capitalist class tie these systems to surveillance at work, to borders and police, to propaganda and war?

Following the circuit from money to commodity to production and back again clarifies the role of so called data, locates the seat of value in living labor, and exposes how rent and cloud accounting make surplus appear to evaporate, laying bare the crisis of overproduction. A scientific analysis of Artificial “intelligence” grasps the class relations behind it and seeks to change them through investigation, organization, and struggle.

AI In Theory

Taxonomy of AI

AI, in the strict technical sense, is not a single thing but a family of computational methods for producing outputs by transforming inputs under a learned or specified rule. At the most

general level an algorithm is any finite, well specified procedure for mapping an input to an output, and in this broad sense algorithms long predate electronic computers. A recipe, a bookkeeping procedure, or a method for extracting square roots are all algorithms insofar as they prescribe an ordered sequence of steps that yields a determinate result when followed correctly. A canonical example is the long division method taught in grade school, a fixed sequence of simple steps which enables computations involving large numbers to be performed. A contemporary example would be a routing algorithm such as the shortest path used in GPS navigation which computes a route through a road network by scoring possible paths and selecting the one with the lowest total cost, where “cost” can mean distance, time, tolls, or traffic. This is why it is more accurate to treat most modern AI as machine learning, and machine learning as a method for constructing models whose behavior is tuned by minimizing a loss or cost function over data rather than as “intelligence” in any human sense. A machine learning model is essentially a computer program that has learned from examples. Instead of being hand-coded with exact rules, it contains adjustable settings, called parameters, that shape how inputs are turned into outputs. During training, an automated process repeatedly tweaks these settings, so the program’s answers get closer and closer to the patterns or relationships found in the data. In the end, the model acts like a well-practiced guesser: given new information, it uses what it learned from past examples to make reasonable predictions or decisions.

The important distinctions are functional. An algorithm is the procedure. A model is the parameterized mapping. Training is the process of fitting the parameters. Inference is the use of the fitted model to produce outputs on new inputs. The currently dominant AI systems are therefore best described as probabilistic function approximators, meaning large-scale pattern learners that guess likely outputs based on past data, industrialized through scale: they become socially powerful not because they possess agency, but because they are inserted into infrastructures that mediate hiring, policing, content distribution, and data workflows.

Within this family, large language models (LLMs) are a specific subtype of machine learning models that operate over sequences of tokens, small units of text that a language model reads and writes. LLMs are trained, at base, to predict the next token given a context window. They are “large” because they contain very high parameter counts and are trained on vast corpora so that next token prediction yields a capability to model syntactic regularities, semantic associations, stylistic patterns, and pragmatic cues across many domains. The crucial point is that this objective produces a general purpose text generation engine (a tool that reads a lot of text and learns how to write new text) without requiring explicit symbolic rules about grammar or meaning.

The model learns statistical structure latent in the training distribution, and its apparent fluency emerges from the fact that much human language and writing is structured, redundant, and strongly patterned. LLMs are most commonly implemented using transformer architectures (meaning a type of AI design that helps computers understand and generate language by looking at how all the words in a sentence relate to each other at once), whose attention mechanisms allow the model to weight relationships among tokens across long contexts, and whose scaling properties have made performance highly



mail to the dock and sometimes I can't get to the dock door because of all the mail out there. There are other operators, truck drivers, and expeditors out there on the dock, and it gets really dangerous. I'm still pretty new and haven't gotten through my 90-day probation since being converted, so I'm nervous about refusing to do what they ask, and I don't know who to go to about it."

Another issue we have encountered here is a broad feeling of exhaustion and frustration. The high rate of work across all units is made worse by the long stretches endured by workers without breaks and mandatory overtime called each night, with only one day off a week throughout this peak period. One worker has told us, "The workers all seem tired and grumpy; the supervisors are on edge and have often been rude. Everyone is burnt out, I think."

Exhausted and overworked workers make more mistakes and are more likely to get hurt or hurt others, especially when working on or around heavy equipment. The pressure put on them by supervisors makes all of this worse. Here in OKC, the workforce is young and new to the industry for the most part, so exploitation is easier to get away with. The supervisors only care about the amount of mail they move, not about our safety or well-being.

The Need for Postal Worker Unity

Due to the fact that USPS is legally obligated to deliver mail to every address in the U.S., it often acts as a dump for deliveries that private companies such as FedEx, UPS, and Amazon don't want to service due to their low margins or unprofitability. Due to this, USPS desperately looks to find ways to profit; disregarding employee safety and pushing them to the brink of exhaustion is just one way it can squeeze out an extra few dollars. This pressure intensifies during peak season, when the post office aims to maximize profits during its busiest period.

OSHA's dismissal of safety concerns in Charlotte and the lack of response from postal unions to recent deaths and injuries show that existing institutions fail to protect postal workers. The only way to stop this assault is for all USPS employees, across crafts, to unite in a single, rank-and-file-led all-postal workers union. Only then can USPS workers harness their collective power through a strike to end the unsafe and exhausting conditions imposed on them.

NLOC Amazon Warehouse Workers Organize Walkout

This last December, a New Day at Amazon-led shop committee at an Amazon Delivery Station in Ohio organized a walkout at the height of "peak season" to combat poor working conditions and pay. During peak season, which begins in late November and extends throughout the month of December, many Amazon workers are forced to work up to 60 hours in mandatory overtime shifts, leading to 12 hour work days. This extended work time occurs on top of the already brutal workload and oppressive conditions Amazon workers experience day to day. In this way they are even further exploited than usual during Peak time.

The New Day at Amazon shop committee organized a mass meeting, figured out key demands, and established a plan to fight for them. They mobilized a few dozen co-workers and walked out demanding more compensation, which was one of the primary grievances raised by the workers. The next day they were given double overtime pay, something the majority of other warehouses did not receive. It was by putting up this fight, and through the tools of mobilization and organization, that the workers won their daily economic demands. New Day at Amazon is a shop organization which is affiliated to the New Labor Organizing Committee, a national organization of workers devoted to reconstituting an independent, class-conscious and militant labor movement within the United States. Through the work of revolutionaries-in-formation on the ground, and the national leadership and the workplace-based shop paper system of the NLOC, these small battles for economic demands are linked to the broader historic struggle against the imperialist system and for the seizure political Power for the multinational US working-class.

In the [January edition](#) of the *New Day at Amazon* shop paper, Amazon warehouse workers explain how the intense pace of the peak season typically leads into a "ramp down" and mass lay-offs for so-called "seasonal associates" in January, and how that is linked to the lessons they have gained from the walk-out, stating:

With the New Year in full swing we are facing the ramp-down period at Amazon. Obviously a large increase in volume due to the holiday season caused Amazon to spend much more money on labor costs. Everything from simply spending more on wages due to overtime worked, to any little gifts given out,

or even providing food was to keep us engaged and coming back everyday. Now after spending all that money and the inevitable decrease in sales, Amazon now looks to keep costs low to start the year. In Q4 of 2024, Amazon made \$187.8 Billion Dollars in net sales. In Q1 of 2025, Amazon made \$155.7 Billion Dollars in net sales. This is a pattern that occurs every single year.

For workers at Amazon, in years past this meant surprise layoffs of seasonal associates, targeted write ups and firings of veteran associates, and enormous amounts of Voluntary Time Off given out. All this adds up to losses for the workers at Amazon and big profits for the capitalists who own and control Amazon.

This means for our organization have continue to lead a fight against Amazon. In 2026, we will need to organize shop committees among every shop and contact we come across. These shop committees will need to lean on our main principle of class struggle. Understanding we are a class against a class: the working class against the capitalist class. Or the associates versus the large shareholders and owners of Amazon. We will do this with our principles leading us. Not the other way around.

All throughout Amazon warehouses, we will need to build up to slowdowns, walk-outs, and strikes. Our aims should be to commence labor action as soon as we have the strength to do so and the timing is right. Meaning our main goal is to use the one weapon we have at our disposal: the collective withholding of our labor. All of this should give us the ability to organize our shop committees into a united union of Amazon workers. We as Amazon workers have to take the momentum we gained from 2025 and transfer it into 2026 using the same methods we used last year. First, by basing ourselves on principles of the working class. Second, by uniting in class struggle for our everyday demands. All so we can unite in shop committees and organize a union that Amazon will not be able to stop.

As 2025 comes to a close and 2026 begins, The Partisan will be highlighting a few struggles and actions that represent and summarize the work of the revolutionary movement in the Unites States over the past year, as part of our column Our Movement In Review. Over the course of the year, revolutionaries around the country grew and developed mass work in the class struggle to modest heights as part of a general move towards deepening our movement's ties among the class and oppressed nations. As we write in our New Year's statement: "There are many challenges before us, but we can overcome them – if we are honest and persistent in Marxist methods." We hope to see 2026 be a Revolutionary New Year which takes this foundation of work to new and greater heights! Workers and Allies Build Neighborhood Defense Around the Country

New Labor Organizing Committee Establishes New Labor Committees, Unites Around Draft Program

In June, the New Labor Organizing Committee (NLOC) announced the establishment of class-conscious workers' circles, called New Labor Committees, around the country.



The stated purpose of these organizations is to "provide local assistance to the shop organizations, help new organizers with establishing and expanding shop organizations, study and propagate the line of New Labor and trade union literature generally, organize opposition to reactionary labor organizations, as well as investigate local working conditions and provide regular reports to be published in *Labor Storm*."

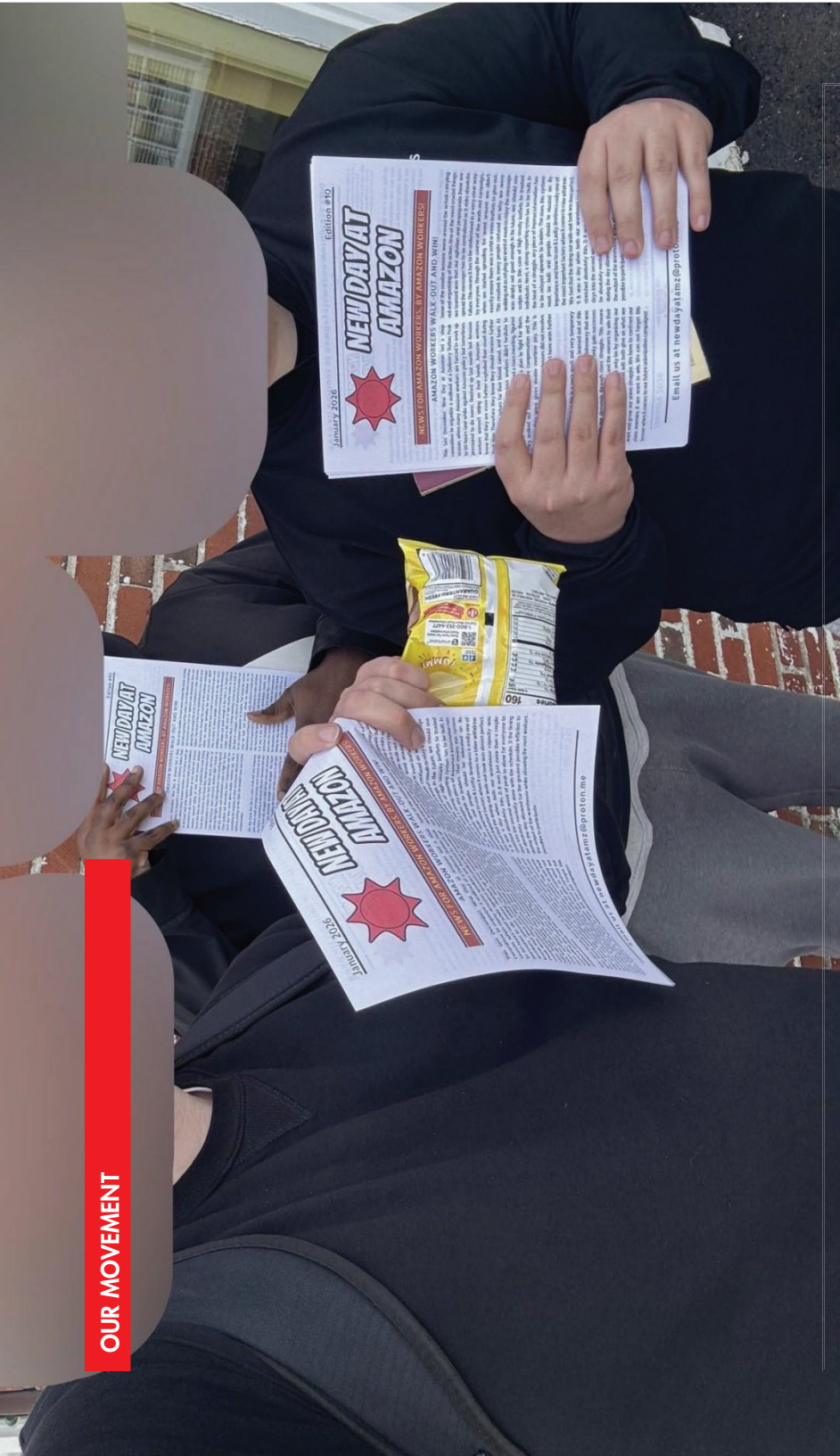


The proliferation of these circles of class-conscious workers, primarily in the logistics, manufacturing, education, and service/retail sectors, demonstrates the growing appetite of the multinational working-class for collective organization and class struggle, in both the labor movement and the broader revolutionary movement in the US.



In August, the NLOC announced that its constituent shop organizations and New Labor Committees had united around a draft program of struggle, which it would implement during the current period of expansion of the New Labor movement. It outlined six principles for the NLOC: the necessity of class struggle, anti-opportunism, proletarian independence, democracy, anti-imperialism, and working-class unity. This represents a major new development in the labor movement, with the growing wave of independent and class-conscious trade unionism in the US continuing to advance in the face of attacks from the ruling class and opportunists in the labor movement.

USPS Workers Report on Peak Season, Their Demands

Mail Handler Assistant Injured in Charlotte

The November edition of *New Day at USPS* reported on the tragic deaths of Russell Scruggs Jr. and Nick Acker, two postal workers who were killed in separate, preventable incidents tied directly to USPS's neglect of worker safety in its push to speed up holiday-season production. Two weeks after the November edition was published, *New Day at USPS* received a report of an injury at the Charlotte Local Processing Center.

A mail handler assistant with less than a month on the job was hit by a forklift on the loading dock. They were hospitalized but luckily not seriously injured. Despite the incident, management immediately demanded that work continue as usual. In response to the injury, a Charlotte postal worker told *New Day at USPS*, "They don't care about us or whether we make it home, just that we get our mail out."

This was entirely preventable. A week before the injury, the Occupational Safety and

Health Administration (OSHA) received reports that Charlotte postal workers lacked first aid equipment and that forklift operators ignored safety rules. OSHA is a federal agency, like USPS, and rather than protecting postal workers and preventing a potentially fatal injury, it protected USPS. Instead of investigating itself, OSHA allowed USPS to conduct its own investigation.

Peak Season Testimony From Oklahoma City

In Oklahoma City, as we entered peak season, high turnover left many workers inexperienced, poorly trained, and unclear on safe practices.

An example of this is the expectations for the PIT equipment operators to handle their machines or the various containers they haul in an unsafe manner. Management will routinely ask the operators to haul loads that far exceed the maximum capacity with equipment that is not suitable for the task. The "2 Prongs" or pallet jacks are regularly called over by supervisors who will attach trains of a dozen postcons full of packages or letters and send them to navigate docks that are full of mail and people in an attempt to satisfy dispatch schedules, putting the workers both on and off the equipment at great risk. One worker has gone on the record saying, "I am often asked to bring out

oppressed nations. On the other hand is the combative energy of the masses, who did not wait for law enforcement to discipline law enforcement, but rather chased the ICE agents away at a demonstration following the shooting.

Imperialist violence and people's resistance

Naked violence has always been a feature of the US capitalist State against the multinational working class and revolutionaries: from the Haymarket massacre and the Bonus Army massacre against striking workers, to the Kent State massacre against students demanding an end to imperialist war, to the genocides committed against the Black/New Afrikan, Puerto Rican, and Indigenous peoples. The blood of our martyrs have never suffocated, but only watered the rebellion of the workers and oppressed nations, who are rising up again with renewed anger and vitality. The examples of countries like China and the history of resistance of workers and the oppressed nations here inside the United States have all taught the same lesson: in opposition to reactionary violence, the people raise up revolutionary violence as the only mean to overcome it.

Just five years ago, George Floyd, an unarmed Black man, was brutally murdered by the police in the same city. And it was the heroic people of Minneapolis who rose up in rebellion and revolutionary violence, burning down the local police precinct in a humiliating defeat for the Old State – the first time in modern history. With this monumental act, the masses of Minneapolis have shown their power to create history according to their own will.

This entire incident highlights the importance of neighborhood and workplace defense organizations of the immigrant masses suffering under class and national oppression. Efforts from organizations like the People's Defense Committee to build *Neighborhood Defense Units* in order to “collect and spread information regarding the actions and tactics of local and federal law enforcement” and “mobilize working and oppressed people in these neighborhoods to confront them” are becoming increasingly important. Only through concrete and consistent efforts to actively combat and resist the Old State can the fury of the masses overflow.

News from the People's Wars

India

December 3: Twelve persons believed to be cadres of the Communist Party and three reactionary policemen were killed in a fierce exchange of fire in West Bastar.

Activists Commemorate International Working Women's Day and May Day



On May 1, revolutionary organizations and their supporters around the country embraced the best traditions of the international revolutionary movement by centering the working-class itself during celebrations of International Workers' Day through taking up the call issued by the NLOC to organize mass meetings of workers. Events, meetings, agitation, and propaganda were done to emphasize the necessity of building an independent, militant, and class-conscious labor movement.

Minneapolis: ICE Murders Protester

On the afternoon of January 7, Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agents carrying out kidnapping operations in Minneapolis shot and killed a woman in her car. Unverified reports identify the woman as Renee Nicole Good, a 37 year-old US citizen, legal observer and mother.

Videos taken by local protesters show numerous ICE vehicles in the neighborhood, with local residents gathered to monitor the situation. The situation between the crowd of masses and ICE agents appeared tense; but contrary to the claim of the Old State, the masses did nothing to provoke the agents. The victim in her car was attempting to drive away from ICE agents as they swarmed the car, and one agent shoots her at point-blank range as she drives past them.

An eyewitness reporting to Minnesota Public Radio that “She was trying to turn around, and the ICE agent was in front of her car, and he pulled out a gun and put it right in — like, his midriff was on her bumper — and he reached across the hood of the car and shot her in the face like three, four times.”¹ This marks another murder by ICE, who during operations have killed 4 people and shot at least 14.

May Day is the day of the majority of our population, the toiling masses of all nations, those who create immense wealth and maintains the society but remain exploited and oppressed. It's a day to politicize, mobilize, and organize the working class and nationally oppressed masses in the fight to destroy capitalism and replace it with a socialist society — one led by the dictatorship of the proletariat, socialized industries, and a planned economy. It is not enough to celebrate the life and work of the working class. We must take a step forward, no matter how small, towards rallying the class and defeating the enemy, growing our movement not through words but deeds of struggles and victories. May Day is a day of militant class struggle.

Every day that passes is a day an immigrant gets separated from their family, a day where a worker is fired for speaking up against mistreatment, a day where a Palestinian child is killed by Zionist bombings, a day that witnesses the further misery of our class and the peoples of the world. The only response that the working class in the United States can give, a response that is becoming more and more urgent every day, is the socialist revolution. May Day, as well as each day before and after it, must mark an advance in the struggle for such a revolution. Each passing year workers in the United States extend their rebellion, spontaneously demanding unions, class struggle and defending their interests despite repression from the owners and the opportunist leadership of establishment labor. As revolutionaries it is our task to give this rebellion theoretical and practical leadership, raising the class consciousness of the workers through struggle, and destroying all backwards influences among them such as state unionism, American national chauvinism (“patriotism”), sexism, and other discriminatory prejudices. In the place of the failed state managed “unions”, we must build a genuine workers' movement by raising the principles of class leadership, proletarian unity, self-reliance, purposeful ideological work, trade union democracy, and militant uncompromising struggle. May Day must mark a step forward in the fight for revolution, growing our movement not through words, but through the hard and difficult organizing actions that advance our class toward victory.

May Day is not just a celebration of past struggles but a call to action. It is a day for workers to politicize, mobilize, and organize for revolutionary change. The struggle against capitalism must be at the forefront, linking our daily struggles to the highest goal of socialist revolution. This May Day, we must go among the workers to gather and systematize their grievances: to demand the right to organize free from state control, defend migrant workers, and build independent, militant, class-oriented organizations to combat the capitalist offensive. Not unrelated is the United States' recent military actions against Venezuela aiming at total control of the Venezuelan energy and mining sectors. Both the domestic offensive by ICE and the violent invasion of Venezuela demonstrate the ways in which the United States has employed violent means to resolve its declining economic situation. The imperialist State's continued threats, such as the beginning of military actions targeting Cuba, Iran, Colombia, Mexico, and Denmark, as well as mass repression and jailing of activists domestically, should not be taken lightly.

The FBI and local Minnesota state authorities have announced a joint investigation into the murder. The Democratic Party has provided a false “opposition” throughout both Trump administrations, using legal theater and electoral bluster to create an illusion of resistance. Immediately, Democratic media and politicians have started to demand a “just” legal process against the ICE murderers using the same laws laid down by the capitalists and it's State — which itself is organized violence against the workers and

Loan Delinquency Rate Climbs as Inequality Increases

Sub-prime auto-lenders such as Tricolor Holdings are collapsing – as more workers are late on their car payments. The sub-prime auto loan delinquency rate (meaning auto loans lent to borrowers with credit scores below 620) is now at 15.78%, at a level unseen since 2000 and surpassing both the height of the COVID-19 pandemic and the imperialist financial crisis of 2008. Delinquency rate for prime or near-prime loans also continue to rise, as used car dealerships witness massive drop in stock value and go out of business.

In simple terms, owning a car has become more expensive, especially for the working class. Average monthly payments have jumped nearly 35% since 2020, as insurance premiums have increased 12% since last year. As poorer buyers take out long loans to cope with this, the rising interest rates and longer terms that followed continue to drag them into financial difficulties.

But auto loans are not unique. On November 24, the [Federal Reserves](#) reported in a note that consumer delinquency rate has reached “levels not observed” since 2008. Credit card loan delinquency rates have witnessed a great increase from all borrowers, especially those with subprime and near-prime credit status and renters. According to the [Department of Education](#), almost 25% of the entire federal student loan portfolio could be in default “in a few months”. To make up for these losses, the Trump administration will begin garnishing wages (i.e. making involuntary collections from workers’ paychecks) from those in default under the “Treasury Offset Program” in 2026.

Why are people not paying their loans on time? In fact, the rising loan delinquency rate is just the tip of the iceberg. More and more Americans have stopped buying things, while “buy now, pay later” options have gotten popular even in grocery shopping. The bourgeois economists have described the phenomenon as a “K-shaped economy”. In their words, while the lowest and lower-income households have supposedly “stopped spending”, the “highest earners and the richest corporations” are witnessing booms: to map this out neatly on a graph, it would look like the two legs of the letter “K”.

For example, the much talked-about AI industry has witnessed tremendous growth. Traditional Big Tech companies and new players like OpenAI, indulging in billions of dollars in revenue and speculation, are also spending massively. Nonetheless, this growth is not limited to the AI market. Big corporations, from oil all the way to food packaging industries, are yielding greater profit and in turn, spending more: like the AI business, they prioritize in machinery and infrastructure. The wealthiest 10% of the population now makes up nearly 50% of all consumer spending in the United States.

For mainstream economists, the reasons for this trend are a mystery. For a worker, however, it is easy to see the relationship between both legs of the so-called “K”. In the words of Karl Marx, capital accumulation is increasingly taking the form of “rising organic composition of capital”, meaning firms substitute labor power for means of production (machines) in competitive struggle. This and other inherent trends of the imperialist-capitalist system produce a greater and greater impoverishment of the working class.

What this concretely means is more surplus of the working population: more unemployment and more general impoverishment. In November 2025, the unemployment rate has risen to 4.6%, the highest since 2021, as inequality has widened to an extreme level. While the big capitalists are entering more and more of a frenzy in their exploitation of the working class in an attempt to outrun the falling rate of profit, they do so in a futile manner – as overproduction continues, the economic crisis is only bound to deepen.



Families of Filipino Migrants Imprisoned by ICE Form Organization

On December 18, Internationale Migrants Day, the Tanggol Migrante Movement (“defend migrants” in Tagalog) launched an organization called Families of Filipinos in Detention (FFIND) at an online press conference.

FFIND is a group formed by relatives, friends, and victims of illegal detention in ICE facilities. According to a spokesperson, it is “united to organize for the release of our loved ones and the fellow kabayan (compatriots) from the horrific and inhuman conditions of the detention system and stand up to the fascist attacks on migrant communities.”

The group aims to campaign for detainees’ release, provide support, and hold US and Philippine officials accountable. Members criticized both governments for neglecting detained Filipinos migrants.

Over 100 Filipino cruise ship workers were deported between April and July 2025, as many more Filipino migrants remain under ICE custody today. An important case was Gregory “Kuya G” Sorio, a father of three, who has been detained by ICE since March and underwent toe amputation due to criminal neglect by the Old State.

Migration to the US has its root cause in the US imperialist plunder of oppressed countries, who supports and develops semi-feudalism and bureaucrat capitalism to facilitate its rule. In the Philippines, however, it is important to note that a National Democratic Revolution is being waged by the Communist Party to achieve national independence and to destroy the rule of US imperialism once and for all.

The Tanggol Migrante Movement is a national alliance of more than 250 community organizations to support and defend the rights of Filipino migrant workers.



In July, Black/New Afrikan revolutionaries relaunched their publication *The Crusader* in a new quarterly format. They emphasized the importance and continued relevance of the 1928 and 1930 Comintern resolutions on the Black national question in the US, and pushed for class-conscious struggle against the class enemy as the only way to advance the Black national struggle in this country.



Over the course of August, revolutionaries around the country commemorated Black August, an important holiday for the Black Liberation movement that commemorates the Black/New Afrikan political prisoners and important events and rebellions in the long struggle for national liberation. In cities including Chicago, Charlotte, and Washington, D.C., revolutionaries held events to emphasize the importance of the Black national struggle to the working and oppressed struggles of the US as a whole, and to emphasize the relevance of the national question in the present day.



Youth Join with Working-Class in Struggle Against Repression and Rising Fascism

This year the progressive students, lead by the Revolutionary Student Union (RSU), deepened their integration and connection with the class-conscious workers and oppressed masses through popular educational events and campaigns of struggle. In March RSU united around and promulgated their new [program](#), in which they highlight principles such as support for socialist revolution led by the multinational working class, opposing imperialism, opportunism, and revisionism, and upholding democratic centralism as their organizational basis and practice as their main teacher.



The students fought for their own progressive demands, such as with the rallies and campaigns at University of Michigan, North Carolina Central University (NCCU), or Johnson & Wales University, and joined with the workers to serve as auxiliaries in their struggle for demands at place like American University.

The ongoing process of fascistization has led to broader State repression of revolutionaries around the country over the last year. Denton Student Union, a chapter of the RSU, was named by Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton as promoting "violent radical leftist rhetoric." This came only months after DSU held a candlelight vigil in August in remembrance of Denton local Jon Ruff, who was murdered in broad daylight, and whose murder case was met



with apathy by the local police. Despite the threats from the State, DSU reaffirmed its commitment to "continue to serve as a bulwark against the fear, isolation, and atomization which the ruling class and their guard dogs seek to impose upon us and our communities."



Amidst the intensifying conflicts and crisis of international imperialism, in particular American imperialism, revolutionary organizations worked throughout the year to carry out their duty as proletarian internationalists inside the belly of the beast.

In June, revolutionaries from several cities held actions condemning the May 21 massacre of Indian Maoists. In Washington, D.C., this call was heeded through an action held at the Indian Embassy. In July, revolutionaries in Columbus, OH, held an education event about the Indian revolution. In September, revolutionary students and supporters with the New York City chapter of RSU held a protest in front of the Indian Consulate in Manhattan, calling to "Stop Operation Kagar." At *The Partisan*, several articles were published in service of proletarian internationalism. On May 31, an article was published outlining the history of the Indian Revolution. On November 20, an article calling to "*Learn from Comrade Hidma!*" was published, highlighting how the comrade never surrendered in the face of brutal attacks from the class enemy.



Revolutionaries pushed for solidarity with the national liberation movements across the world. On March 8 in Columbus, OH, comrades honored the then-recently deceased Brazilian revolutionary Fausto Arruda, founder of the important newspaper *A Nova Democracia*. Comrades at *The Crusader* also emphasized the importance of the struggle in Brazil and its relevance to the US in their article "*Revolution in Brazil, Revolution Here*," originally published on July 11.



Over 2025, the continued importance of Palestine was emphasized around the country. The RSU pushed forwards a campaign to defend Palestinian-American student and activist Tarek Bazrouk, who was arrested by the FBI in New York City on May 7 as part of the ongoing offensive against the pro-Palestinian movement. On October 7, the PDC, RSU, *The Crusader*, and NLOC, all signed a joint statement on the second anniversary of the Al-Aqsa Flood, extending proletarian internationalist solidarity to the ongoing armed national liberation struggle of the Palestinian people in the face of brutal genocide. Revolutionaries in several cities, including Providence, RI, held large-scale walkouts of students on this date.
